# 3. Confirmation of previous minutes – 8<sup>th</sup> June, 2022

### 4. IFSSH membership

The ExCo have recommended the IFSSH membership of an existing Georgian Society - the Hand Surgery Branch of Medical Foundation "Mkurnali" - be terminated, noting no communication has been possible and financial commitments are outstanding since 2014, to allow the Georgian Society for Surgery of the Hand to pursue their current membership application.

The ExCo has reviewed applications from Emirates Hand Surgery Society and Georgian Society for Surgery of the Hand. Both applications have satisfied the IFSSH bylaws criteria for membership providing their foundation documents, charters, and Board and membership details. Emirates has sponsorship letters from our member societies of Kuwait, Egypt and India; Georgia from Finland, India and Israel. The ExCo recommend their membership applications to the Delegates' Council.



### 5. President's Report

Daniel Nagle reminded the delegates that, in the period between the 2022 annual meeting and this annual meeting, the Delegates' Council had participated in an online review of the bylaws. These amendments were presented electronically, voted upon and accepted. The current Bylaws are dated <u>15<sup>th</sup> November 2022</u> and available on the IFSSH website. These Bylaws realign the duration of the ExCo members to a triennial term and include increased detail of duties and succession plans for each position.

Daniel Nagle detailed the organisational structure of the IFSSH, with the Delegates being the pivotal role between the membership of individual societies and the IFSSH. With the introduction of five Member-at-Large positions (increasing from the one Member-at-Large in the previous ExCo term, and now based on geographical representation) at the 2022 IFSSH Delegates' Council meeting, there is now also a point person that IFSSH Delegates can raise issues or provide feedback. Delegates are also encouraged to keep in regular communication with the IFSSH Administrative Secretary and the Executive Committee officers.

The next Executive Committee organisational change to come into effect under the current Bylaws will be the dissolution of the President-Elect position. This will occur in 2027 to reduce the leadership time in office.



### 6. Secretary-General's Finance Report (Appendix A)

David Warwick informed the Delegates' Council that the value of the IFSSH treasury at August 31st 2023 was US\$2,389,708.70. This comprises \$425K in the Wells Fargo bank accounts and \$1,955K in the Fidelity investment accounts.

The IFSSH treasury has been consistently increasing for many years though fluctuates (e.g. investment accounts reduced by \$90K in past few days) and can be impacted by world events at any time. The IFSSH honours many commitments through the treasury - congresses, courses, CES, operational expenses.

Income sources are the IFSSH annual member dues, triennial congress profits and other smaller items (e.g. donations of book royalties).

Expenditure is incurred through the running of the IFSSH - e.g. legal and accountancy consultants, webmaster/IT costs, Ezine production (editor, layout artist and distribution costs), ExCo travel expenses and the salary of the secretariat. These costs are kept to a minimum and work provided by e.g. the webmaster (Santhosh Kumar, Coimbatoire) is provided for a very reasonable annual honorarium.

The Committee for Educational Sponsorship utilises IFSSH funding to support worthy projects. The IFSSH Mid-Term Course also receives guaranteed funding through the CES. The overall CES funding has increased in recent years and, in combination with the increasing investment portfolio, it is anticipated that the interest related to \$1,500K of this will assist with supporting increased expenses and CES funding.

Funds currently in the accounts with designated purposes include:

- \$100,000 that is available to each upcoming IFSSH triennial congresses as a seed grant (to be repaid two weeks before the commencement of the congress)
- \$500,000 provided through a legacy donation, kept in a Fidelity investment account specifically to be used for the IFSSH Harold Kleinert Visiting Professorship scheme. This corpus will hopefully generate income that allows the future IFSSH Harold Kleinert Visiting Professors to be funded from the interest.

As the IFSSH grows, the expenses will increase - e.g. administrative, legal, IT costs will be incurred. The ExCo has implemented a sub-committee to investigate options to increase income and so to support more activities in future. - refer to Item 13.

### 7. Committee for Educational Sponsorship (CES) Report

Raja Sabapathy, CES Chair, reported on recent sponsorships provided since the 2022 IFSSH Delegates' Council Meeting. These include:

US\$10,000 to assist low-middle income registrants to attend the 2023 World Symposium on Congenital Malformations of the Hand and Upper Limb (Minneapolis, Minnesota, 16-19 May 2023). An application process was administered by the congress organisers and successful applicants were from Bangladesh, the Philippines and Tunisia. Two further awardees were unable to attend for visa/travel reasons.

- US\$10,000 to assist attendance of surgeons, trainees and therapists from developing nations to attend the 13th APFSSH Congress (Singapore, 31 May - 3 June 2023). This was shared amongst 25 successful applicants, chosen by the congress organisers.
- US\$10,000 to continue WALANT education in Africa, through a workshop in Mombasa (April 2023).
- US\$18,000 towards the production of a textbook: "Current Practice of Hand Surgery".
   This will be published by Elsevier and be available for purchase at the 2025 IFSSH Congress.
- Up to US\$20,000 to the 2023 IFSSH Harold Kleinert Visiting Professorship program. This
  was awarded to the Polish Society who hosted Prof Jin Bo Tang for an intensive program
  in September 2023 refer to Item 14.

The IFSSH has gained reports from the grant recipients and individuals that are sponsored. These are all placed on the IFSSH website (<a href="https://ifssh.info/ifssh-sponsored-educational-projects.php">https://ifssh.info/ifssh-sponsored-educational-projects.php</a>) and published in the Ezine. The reports show the impact of the activity on the recipients - improving their hand surgery education and building networks of colleagues.

Raja Sabapathy appealed to the Delegates to share the news of the CES to their societies. Good applications are required to ensure hand surgery education increases around the world. These should be relevant to the hand surgery activities undertaken in the region and appropriate for the infrastructure available. # 8. Communication Director's Report (inc. website and social media)

Jin Bo Tang reported on updates to the IFSSH website. Alterations will be released shortly that will have the website more focused on current and important items.

A series of 30+ educational videos from the IFSSH London 2022 Congress will be uploaded to the educational tab - coordinated by David Shewing (IFSSH Member-at-Large, Europe/Africa). Consent has been gained from the presenters; the IFSSH is now working on the technical aspects for the upload.

Improvements to social media have occurred, led by Aida Garcia (IFSSH Member-at-Large, South America). Posts are now placed regularly, often in themes, and explain the components of the IFSSH (history, congresses, Pioneers, member news and meetings, etc) as well as items of general interest (e.g. hand art).

Jin Bo Tang requested the delegates to contribute news of international relevance, stories from Pioneers, advertisements and photographs from national meetings, etc.

### 9. Newsletter / Ezine

David Warwick reminded Delegates that the IFSSH Newsletter is published quarterly: within the Ezine, in the JHS(American) and JHS(Asian-Pacific), and on the JHS(European) website.

The IFSSH Ezine continues to be edited by Prof Ulrich Mennen (IFSSH Past-President). The publication has now been produced for over 12 years (51 issues available).

Delegates are asked to ensure their society contributes to the Ezine at least annually - an invite is sent out to each delegate once a year, rolling through the 60+ IFSSH societies over the 4 issues. Content is always needed. This could be an updated member history, local news from the society/region or a piece of interest about an IFSSH event/sponsorship/Pioneer/etc. Pieces should be forwarded to ezine@ifssh.info.

Greg Bain requested that Delegates engage with their Member-at-Large, through routine requests (e.g. updating society histories on the IFSSH website, providing Ezine news) and with ideas for future activities and improvements. Delegates were asked to group into their regions at the conclusion of today's meeting to meet their Member-at-Large and regional colleagues.

# 10. 15<sup>th</sup> IFSSH Congress - London, 2022 (Appendix B)

David Shewring (Chair, IFSSH 2022) provided the final congress report to the Delegates' Council, thanking all for their attendance at the London Congress during which the Council last met.

The 2022 Congress was a combined event of the IFSSH, IFSHT and FESSH - held at ExCeL in June 2022. The final tally was 3700 registrations with 630 online participants.

### Highlights included:

- the congress travelling fellowship program (32 fellows from 30 countries visiting 18 UK centres and then joining the congress)
- honouring 28 IFSSH Pioneers
- 1700 presentations, 960 free papers
- the IFSSH Swanson Lecture (Tim Davis, "Current concepts on management of scaphoid injuries"); the President's Lecture (Gus McGrouther, "A battle between germ, host and surgeon) and the BSSH Douglas Lamb Lecture (David Ring, "The influence of psychological factors on outcomes")
- the "Tendon disorders of the Hand and Wrist" textbook, included in the registration
- participation in the social events pub night and the Gala dinner at Old Billingsgate, plus the invitation-only President's dinner.

 the Closing Ceremony with the handover of IFSSH Presidency from Marc Garcia-Elias to Daniel Nagle, with the younger generation of congress fellowship recipients watching on.

The meeting had the support of 45 companies, providing GBP £654,425.

Financially the congress ended with a surplus of GBP £211,734. The congress organisers had undertaken a financial commitment to FESSH and provided US\$81,778 to the IFSSH with the same amount also going to FESSH.

Overall, the highlight for many participants was the opportunity to meet face-to-face again after the pandemic. It was a meeting of high-quality exchanges and reunited friendships.

# 11. 16<sup>th</sup> IFSSH Congress – Washington D.C., 2025 (Appendix C)

Jim Chang (Co-Chair, IFSSH 2025) addressed the Delegates' Council. The 2025 Congress will be a meeting hosted by the ASSH, AAHS and ASHT. The USA has not hosted an IFSSH Congress since 1983 making this opportunity an honour for the combined surgical/therapy colleagues to showcase their country and hospitality.

The Congress will be held 23-28 March 2025, providing a setting in Washington, D.C. during cherry blossom season and distanced in time from the AAHS, FESSH and ASSH meetings of that year.

The Marriott Marquis has been chosen as the meeting site. This has a conference capacity of 3500 people, is on-site for hotel rooms (easy accessibility) and is within walking distance of the major city sights.

The 2025 hosts have maintained their bid promise to deliver the congress at the same registration rate as London 2022. Early surgeon rates will be US\$750 (increasing to \$850 regular rates and \$950 on site). Specific rates are available for Residents/Fellows, Allied Health and Therapists.

The congress organisers have developed a "BOGO" plan: Buy One, Get One Free registration. This applies to countries specified by the World Bank's as low and lower middle income countries and embodies the IFSSH objective to be inclusive and develop education worldwide.

The schedule will run from Sunday (pre-meetings) through to the closing ceremony on Friday and include social events such as the Opening Ceremony (Monday, Marriott Marquis), President's Dinner (Spy Museum), event TBA on Wednesday evening (likely music or sport venue) and the Gala Banquet at the National Portrait Gallery on Thursday evening.

A congress textbook will be published: "Trauma Reconstruction", edited by Warren Hammert, David Ruch and Fraser Leversedge, written by a variety of international authors.

Similarly to London, a congress travelling fellowship will be organised. This will be coordinated by the AAHS and be concentrated on the US East Coast (planning may include centres such as the Hospital for Special Surgery, New York; Philadelphia Hand Center, Philadelphia; Curtis Hand Center, Baltimore).

Important upcoming dates include;

- Abstract open date: Dec 4, 2023
- Review of abstracts: February 2024 (>12m prior to meeting to allow for visa applications and processing times)
- Final program: July 2024

### Meeting: March 2025

On behalf of the hosts, Jim Chang encouraged delegates to join the 2025 Congress - to experience American hand surgery, to witness >50% of program speakers being international, to be able to bring LMIC trainees under the free registration plan, and to enjoy spring in Washington DC, all whilst reconnecting with friends from around the world.

### 12. 1st IFSSH Mid-Term Course in Hand Surgery - Ecuador (Appendix D)

Fidel Cayon, (ECUMANO IFSSH Delegate and Mid-Term Course Convenor) presented the current status of the 1<sup>st</sup> IFSSH Mid-Term Course in Hand Surgery and introduced Dr Gabriel Alegria, ECUMANO President, to the delegates.

The course will be held 31 January - 3 February 2024 in Quito, Ecuador. The site is the Quito Metropolitan Convention Centre. There are many international speakers joining the meeting to present topics, with the four keynote speakers sponsored by the IFSSH. The program will run in two main rooms with smaller offset rooms for workshops and "meet and greet" sessions.

This is an instructional course comprised of lectures.

The meeting will be conducted in English, with Spanish translation occurring throughout. A large contingent of Latin American registrants are expected, but with the meeting open to all worldwide.

Six hotels have been selected for the housing to allow a range of costs/facilities.

The IFSSH provides a US\$20,000 grant to the host society. This has been supplemented with generous sponsorship from industry. The platinum sponsors are Disortho/TriMed, Medartis, Ortomacx Inquiort, Zoldan Corp and Acumed.

Registration is open - US\$297.50 early bird rate for surgeons, \$170.00 for residents/fellows/therapists and \$85 for pre-graduate students. These rates are available until 31st October, then increase to the regular rates of \$350, \$200 and \$100 respectively.

Fidel Cayon requested that the delegates pass on this news to all in their societies and encourage early registrations.

### 13. Business arising from Executive Committee Meeting

### a. Hand Surgery Resource

Daniel Nagle announced to the Delegates' Council that the IFSSH has been offered the opportunity of ownership of "Hand Surgery Resource" (HSR) and, at yesterday's Executive Committee Meeting, the ExCo have agreed upon this transfer.

The HSR is an online resource available worldwide, free of charge. It was created by - and continues to be run by - Larry Hurst (New York). The resource includes a website, videos,

newsletters, podcasts and more. A link to the HSR is already functioning on the IFSSH website: <a href="https://ifssh.info/hand-surgery-resource.php">https://ifssh.info/hand-surgery-resource.php</a>

Under the transfer, the IFSSH will now own the HSR but it will remain under Larry Hurst's oversight until he chooses to step down. Previously there was a combined approach from Larry Hurst and the IFSSH to develop an international committee to continue with monitoring and updating the HSR content - known as the International Hand Surgery Resource Advisory Group (IHSRAG). This group will now be expanded. It requires commitment from IFSSH members to continue the updating of topics.

The IFSSH is proud to have been approached by Larry Hurst with this proposal. It is another method of ensuring international hand surgery education is available to the world in accessible formats.

### b. IFSSH Finance Sub-Committee

David Warwick introduced the IFSSH Finance Sub-Committee: Greg Bain, Paco Pinal and Jorge Clifton.

Greg Bain explained that this sub-committee would be moving forward with fundraising initiatives to improve the IFSSH treasury and allow the IFSSH to undertake expanded activities and organisational growth. To maintain a positive impact on global education, a funding base is necessary. Many societies have specific financial programs and/or foundations. The IFSSH to date has maintained its treasury through dues payments and congress contributions, but a fundraising model will improve opportunities.

The sub-committee is preparing proposals of ways to raise money and looking at specific groups that may be interested in donating or leaving legacies. The committee is also considering a systematic way to recognise donors - e.g. a "Knights of Hand Surgery" title for those who provide a dedicated financial commitment to the IFSSH. Other considerations being discussed include the possibility of named lectures or fellowships.

The IFSSH represents many countries of disparate income and infrastructure levels so, whilst education needs to be relevant to local circumstances, so do fundraising initiatives - those from wealthier backgrounds may be able to donate more but, regardless of the amount, all will be valued for their generosity towards international hand surgery and education.

The program is planned to be operational for commencement at the 2025 IFSSH Congress.

### c. IFSSH Scientific Committee for Congenital Conditions

Raja Sabapathy noted that this committee continues to undertake periodic reviews of the OMT Classification. This classification was endorsed by the IFSSH through the Scientific Committee program with a recommendation that it be regularly reviewed.

The current committee consists of Wee Lam (Singapore), Charles Goldfarb (USA), Wiebke Husselmann (Germany), David McCombe (Australia) and Lindley Wall (USA).

The committee will be commencing a new activity: assisting hand surgeons with difficult congenital classifications. An email address will be activated that allows hand surgeons to contact the committee with deidentified descriptions of congenital presentations; the committee will respond with classification assistance.

### d. Global partnerships

David Warwick advised that the IFSSH will be requesting information from all member societies in relation to global work undertaken - this may include countries where outreach programs are active, web resources that assist hand surgeons in non-member societies, etc. Requests for the information will be sent out via email to all delegates and all input will be gratefully received in the hope that a resource can be established on the IFSSH website.

### e. IFSSH Member Society histories

Members-at-Large have contacted all societies in their regions requesting updated society histories. These are placed on the IFSSH website and may be published in the Ezine. Delegates are asked to provide a history if one is not already present on the IFSSH website - <a href="https://ifssh.info/member\_nation-histories.php">https://ifssh.info/member\_nation-histories.php</a> - or to review/update existing documents. These should be forwarded to the relevant Member-at-Large.

### 14. New business

David Warwick opened the meeting to new business.

### a. IFSSH 2028 Congress - Singapore

Bernice Hong (Singapore Society proxy) greeted the Delegates' Council on behalf of the Singapore Society. She advised that their organising committee has commenced planning, with the operational structures currently being formed.

### b. FLACM Congress, 2023

Efrian Farias (Mexican Society proxy) noted that the Latin-American Federation Congress is to be held 6-11 November 2023 in Mexico and extended an invitation to all. *Refer to Item* 15: FLACM Report.

### c. Jin Bo Tang - education - textbook and IFSSH Harold Kleinert Visiting Professorship

At the request of Raja Sabapathy, Jin Bo Tang shared news of his recent educational activities for the IFSSH. He advised he is the Editor of the "Current Practice of Hand Surgery" textbook, as earlier mentioned by the CES. The writing is underway and 27 IFSSH member societies are represented by authors involved in the production.

Jin Bo Tang also noted that he had arrived in Toronto this week straight from the IFSSH Harold Kleinert Visiting Professorship. This involved 16 days in Poland, as the guest of the Polish Society. The Professorship was a busy period, incorporating a large geographical tour to reach numerous groups of Polish surgeons and trainees. He gave 25 lectures, performed 10 operations, instructed at 10 cadaver workshops and taught at medical schools. His tour was centred around the annual meeting of the Polish Society. Jin Bo Tang noted the impact of the Professorship on the Polish surgeons, describing the President's 6 hour drive to attend a dinner in recognition.

This is an excellent opportunity if a society has an appropriate program and considering a relevant professor - proposals should be placed to the IFSSH CES at least 12 months in advance to allow the IFSSH to review applications before the professor is invited.

### d. Indian Society's 60th anniversary

Anil Bhat, the IFSSH Delegate from the Indian Society, congratulated the IFSSH on its activities and plans. He advised that the Indian Society has celebrated its 60<sup>th</sup> (diamond) anniversary this year with a notable congress and festivities. He suggested that milestones such as this can be

useful for fundraising/awareness campaigns. The IFSSH was formed in 1966 - currently celebrating its  $57^{th}$  year.

### **IFSHT AWARDS AND SPONSORSHIP ACTIVITY**

- IFSHT Evelyn Mackin Congress Grant: sponsorship of therapists from developing countries to attend triennial congress. In 2022, with financial support from IFSSH and IFSHT funds fully supported four therapists to attend the congress. Therapists were from Bhutan, Bulgaria, Fiji, and Kuwait. IFSHT covers all Congress related expenses with this grant. Total amount awarded was 10,008 USD. IFSSH provided 9761.17 USD (after bank fees) to support this grant.
- IFSHT/IFSSH Triennial Congress Grant: Ten recipients were awarded grant funds to support, registration, accommodation and/or travel to the 2022 Congress. Funds were distributed based on guidelines, specifically for countries with low GDP, for associate members who had not attended the Congress previously, with funds from the 2019 Silent Auction specifically used to support speakers and poster presenters.
  - Total amount awarded was 13,613 USD. IFSHT received 2562 USD from IFSSH (after bank fees) to support this grant.
- IFSHT-IFSSH International Hand Therapy Teaching Awards. Grants up to 1500 USD are available
  to support therapists teaching hand therapy in less-developed countries. None awarded since 2022
  Congress.
- Cristina Alegri Award for Innovation in Hand Therapy: 4 nominations were accepted in 2022 and
  the award went to Hayley Fay from the United Kingdom for her development of an exercise prescription
  app called "Hand Therapy."
- IFSHT Lifetime Achievement Award: 10 awards were granted in 2022

# **DYNAMOMETER DONATIONS:**

- IFSHT has 13 to distribute.
- Since the 2022 Congress we have provided dynamometers to therapists in Vietnam, Niger, Sierre Leonne, Ecuador and Fiji.

### **APFSSH Report to IFSSH**

Since the last IFSSH meeting in London 2022 the APFSSH has continued to develop its educational role in the Asian Pacific Region. As was reported last meeting the APFSSH has opened a bank account in Singapore to facilitate financial support for hand surgery in the region and are now registered as a society in Singapore. We have an office in Singapore supported by Bened, our administrative assistant who is essential in assisting with the functions of the Executive and delegate meetings and keeping records of our activities.

The Singapore Hand Surgery Society convened the most recent APFSSH meeting in Singapore last May. This was the first face to face meeting since the 2020 Melbourne meeting and the subsequent COVID lockdowns. It was a great success and the organizers, Mark Puhaindran and Jacqueline Tan are to be congratulated for their efforts. Amongst the highlights of the meeting was the launch of a book, Crafting a Legacy. This book celebrates the lives and contributions of all the IFSSH Pioneers of Hand Surgery from the Asian Pacific region written where possible by members who know and knew these great people. The theme for this meeting was Diverse and Inclusive, a very timely theme considering the real diversity in our region. Jennifer Green and Ted Mah from Australia ran two symposia on Diversity and Inclusivity in Hand Surgery with contributions from many surgeons from the Asian Pacific Region and Europe looking at various issues and how these are being addressed. DePuy Synthes Asia Pacific then held a Symposia focusing on Gender Diversity again with contributions from many surgeons. These sessions were a first for the APFSSH and will become a regular event in future conferences as we all strive for equality and equity in hand surgery in our region.




As part of the need for greater diversity and to maintain a healthy growing Executive we have reverted to biennial APFSSH meetings with a fixed term of 2 years for the executive positions and have opened the positions of President elect, Secretary General and Treasurer to nomination and open election. The previous tradition of climbing through the ranks to Presidency was a journey of 12 years with very little opportunity for contributions from other surgeons who may well have greater contributions to the Federation. An organization such as ours must have this opportunity for reinvigoration with new blood to reflect our rapidly developing region. In order to give more members some exposure to the running of such a Federation and to also bring new ideas to the Executive we have established 5 positions for Members -at-Large who ideally would learn about the running of the Federation with a view to a more active role in the executive. These members are ideally drawn from member societies who do not otherwise have representation on the Executive. With this change the next APFSSH meeting will be held in Chennai India in 2025.

As part of our expansion, we have now formed Education, Finance and Outreach committees to develop further programs for our region. The education committee has been very busy developing protocols for the APFSSH Travelling Fellowship and the APFSSH Visiting Professor. These programs will be announced in the APFSSH Newsletter later this month and on our website. As part of our Educational Programs in the Region, Jonathan Hobby has been investigating the possibility of running a FESSH Foundation Course in Hand Surgery in the Asian Pacific Region in conjunction with the APFSSH, possibly as early as 2024. Our finance Committee is charged with the management of our funds received from subscriptions, conference profits and generous donations. I would like to acknowledge a very generous donation from Raja Sabapathy that will be used to kickstart our educational activities. The Outreach committee is in its earliest development and will look at trying to coordinate and assist with the many outreach programs that are currently running in our region. The APFSSH Newsletter, "Hands On" has been a wonderful success due to the editorial excellence of Sandeep Sebastin from Singapore. This facilitates communication between the Executive and other members societies and between individual societies.

The APFSSH now has 13 Member Societies with other regional societies in the process of applying for membership of the Federation. Some countries in our area do not yet have an established national society so individuals from those countries may apply for individual associate membership of the APFSSH. It is certainly important that we remain as diverse and inclusive as possible in order to achieve our main aim of promoting hand surgery training and excellence in the Asian Pacific Region.

# **Appendix H: HWBI Report**

# Hand and Wrist Biomechanics International (HWBI)

HWBI is thrilled and grateful to be an Allied Organization of IFSSH, and we are looking forward to an exciting 16<sup>th</sup> IFSSH Congress in Washington, D.C. in 2025.

HWBI strives to provide an international forum for those interested in the biomechanical aspects of basic and clinical research focusing on the hand and the wrist, to encourage international collaborations among engineers, clinicians, therapists, and others in the area of hand and wrist biomechanics, to promote knowledge of hand and wrist biomechanics and its clinical and practical applications, all in cooperation with IFSSH and ISB.

During the combined congress of the IFSSH, IFSHT & FESSH in 2022, held in London, UK, HWBI hosted a biomechanics session with 12 talks ranging from how biomechanics has influenced clinical practices, as well as rehabilitation methods, to carpus simulations, to carpal arch mechanics, and to thumb CMC joint laxity in young and postmenopausal women.

As a Technical Group of the International Society of Biomechanics (ISB), HWBI held its most recent symposium in August 2023 in conjunction with ISB in Fukuoka, Japan. It was an outstanding event, filled with exceptional scientific content, as well as a wonderful location and opportunities for networking. Our symposium was similarly successful. Our session was highlighted by three keynote speakers: Toshiyasu Nakamura, MD, PhD, University of Health and Welfare, Tokyo, Japan, Nina Suh, MD, Emory University School of Medicine, Atlanta, GA, USA, and Zong-Ming Li, PhD, University of Arizona, Tuscan, AZ, USA. The symposium also hosted 16 speakers from all over the world, and topics ranging from median nerve mechanics to finite element analysis of carpal ligaments to detection of hand motion with state-of-the-art tracking systems. The first-place prize in our Young Scholar Awards went to Denise Balogh, Nipissing University, North Bay, Canada, for her and her teams work entitled "Median Nerve Deformation Increases During Repeated Efforts of a Pulp-Pinch Grip Task." The second place prize was awarded to Kazuya Kurauchi and co-authors from Hiroshima University, Hiroshima, Japan for their work on "Coordinated muscle activity during chopstick manipulation".

In collaboration with IFSSH for the 2025 Congress we hope to support several sessions on wrist biomechanics. Our proposed themes will focus on the biomechanics of total wrist arthroplasty, carpal tunnel, and thumb CMC joint. More exciting details to come.
